Thank you to all those who made an application. Seven applications were received covering eight houses. Funding requests ranged from \$3,000 to \$10,500.

All applications were successful and funding to the value of \$39,963 was approved.

Bucaan Community House	Everyday Literacy for Bhutanese Elders – use ATMs, sign names, recognise street signs, understand pricing, weights and quantities, compare prices	\$10,500
Devonport Community House	Creating Your Child's Own Fairy-tale – upskill parents of pre-school children in computer literacy, introduced them to pre-school educational software and have them create a children's book	\$5,540
Dorset Community House	Literacy Technology Support – on the move technology support for literacy tutoring in remote locations	\$3,778
Dunalley Tasman Neighbourhood House and Okines Community House	Making Ends Meet – a plain English and hands on approach to budgeting, credit cards, running a car, feeding the family, saving money and dealing with bureaucracies	\$5,000 and \$1,000 contingency
Geeveston Community Centre	Cracking the Code Stage 2 – incorporate literacy support into all projects at the centre, promote literacy and support literacy tutors	\$6,945
Maranoa Heights Community Centre	Maranoa Meeting Place – Offer local Aboriginal families a range of literacy-based activities with families from other cultural groups from Sudan	\$4,200
West Moonah Community House	Learner Driver Course – Tutor Sudanese community members in obtaining their Learner Driver (L1) qualification	\$3,000
